From the Desk of Fr. Jon

The Church New Year & A Visit to the Monastery

Each September 1st we renew our spiritual journey with the Ecclesiastical New Year. Whether we have had a difficult year, spiritually speaking, or a great year, we take time to reflect on our Orthodox Christian journey and if we are truly making progress. In truth, our spiritual father confessor is the one best to reflect on our progress or lack thereof. Yet, there are some easy questions we can ask ourselves that help us reflect.

1. Am I coming to Liturgy on time and every Sunday possible?
2. Did I read my Bible daily and how did I apply what I read?
3. Did I spend more or less time in prayer than watching TV or on social media?
4. How am I a witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ to those around me?

Depending on how we answer these questions to ourselves, we can gage our spiritual efforts. Perhaps, just start with creating a “Spiritual Food” folder on your phone or tablet and sign up for the daily readings app from the Archdiocese, which by the way, also has prayers and brief descriptions of the lives of saints! Download the “Orthodox Study Bible” app for \$9.99. You spend more than that for an average lunch and the food you receive from the OSB feeds your soul towards salvation and eternal life! Download the “Pray Always” app. There is so many blessings in these prayers. Download the ΟΡΘΟΔΟΞΟ ΠΡΟΣΕΥΧΗΤΑΡΙ (“Proseuhitari”) app for \$3.95 if you prefer to pray in Greek.

With all of these spiritual weapons and food at your fingertips there is no reason to go hungry again. It is not too late to wait. Resolve to come to church every Sunday on time for Liturgy. Read the daily readings on your phone – 6 minutes, that is literally all it takes. Start your day with prayer so the spiritual battles of the day are guided by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through discernment in the Spirit.

An Opportunity for Spiritual Renewal – A trip to the Monastery

This Ecclesiastical New Year come with us to the Monastery of Panagia Prousiotissa in Troy, North Carolina. This women’s monastery nestled in the rolling hills of the North Carolina piedmont is a spiritual gem of Christ in our midst! Gerontissa (Abbess) Agne and the sisters are planning to welcome a group from St. Nicholas, Wednesday, September 6 – Friday, September 8, 2017. We plan to depart from the St. Nicholas parking lot at noon and return on Friday at approximately 3pm. There is no cost to the trip! Please bring some funds to donate to the monastery as a kindness for their continued prayers for us. Also, you will find a wide selection of icons and books and home items available for purchase. Think of your friends and relatives here also.

What to expect? What do I bring with me on our trip to the monastery? Proper clothing such as long sleeves, long pants, or a modest dress, and a head covering for the ladies. Always bring a loving heart. The services are mostly in Greek, and the chanting by the sisters is so beautiful. Pack light and weather appropriate. Expect to be asked to help in some way for the work of the monastery. The sisters work very hard each day and we always join in the work in some way. The services in general are in the early morning and early evening. The hospitality is amazing and the nuns do not eat meat, and thus neither do we while visiting the monastery. You may have the opportunity to go to confession while you are visiting.

What not to expect? Do not expect to see mirrors at the monastery. The focus is always on the icons of Christ and the Panagia! The hospitality rooms are very simply furnished with single beds. The men and women always sleep in separate rooms. There are showers available for the guests and yes, the nuns will wake you for services in the morning!

A Monastery Visit Short Story

One year, Presbytera Barbara and I were visiting the monastery in Saxonburg, Pennsylvania prior to the feast of St. Elias. We were helping the nuns prepare by dipping beeswax candles. It got to be late afternoon and the work was continuing in the basement of the hospitality house at the monastery. Gerontissa Theophano grabbed the petrahilion hanging on the wall and handed it to me and said, “Please begin the Paraklesis Father.” I asked, “Here?” She answered, “Yes Father.” I put on the petrahilion and began, “Blessed is our God...” The sisters began the Small Paraklesis and chanted it by heart as we continued to work. I thought we had already entered the kingdom of God for the beauty of the faith in Christ Jesus and their love for our Panagia. **This is joy of our “speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord...”**
