From the Desk of Fr. Jon

Taking time or making time for our Orthodox Christian Faith!

Our Orthodox Christian Faith is one of the great blessings we have in our lives. The scheduling of our lives is one of the great challenges. If we take a minute right now to analyze our choices, we can clearly see where our priorities are. Are they with Christ and His Church, or are our priorities aligned with our own self interests? Do we show respect for our God by showing up in a timely manner and frequently to divine services? Would we show more respect being invited our relative's or friend's home, than to God's home?

Taking time or making time?

Do we take time out our day to spend time with God? We should! Think about the best time to give to God, not when we are tired but attentive. **Set aside 10 or 15 minutes** just to place your soul in His hands, say some prayers for yourself, pray for others and read the daily bible passages. This can easily be accomplished on a daily basis.

Making time is like it sounds. This is when we are struggling to carve out a little time for God. God is not at the top of our list and thus we give Him our leftovers. If we exercise our free will for His glory, we discover what is pleasing to God and become His true servants. Repentance becomes natural for us, joy starts to enter our hearts, the grace of God is given and we lead purpose driven lives in Christ Jesus. With His word dwelling in us and walking with us, we begin to handle all that comes to us throughout the day with discernment. As believers in the one true God, life can be filled trials, but also with solutions that are grace filled.

Let us find our spiritual haven! Let us take time, not make time, in the morning, at lunch, after dinner or before bed to be with God in Christ. If we can do this for 30 days in a row, we can create a new good habit that will bless us and those around us. When we are looking for real solutions for the problems in our lives, we have to place them at the feet of Jesus on the Cross and then follow through on where God would take us. We might be surprised by the answers to our prayers!

The Lord has the answers we are looking for, not me. Yet, it does make good spiritual sense to do all that is within our control to help ourselves while serving God. As your priest, I invite you to share your struggles with me so I may help you and lift them up in prayer. A life in Christ is filled with opportunities to serve Him and to hear the call to minister to many. May our hearts and ears be open to listen to the still small voice of our great God. May His love penetrate deep within us, that is may become a spring unto eternal life!

Our time with Panagia!

At the beginning of August, we have a special time dedicated to the commemoration of the Theotokos and ever-Virgin Mary, our Panagia! During August 1-14, every evening at 6pm we have either the Small Paraklesis, the Great Paraklesis or Great Vespers. Let us plan from now to take the time and ask for the intercessions of the Mother of God for our spiritual family and ourselves. She has promised to help us forever! Such is the love of the Panagia who gave birth God in the flesh. This is also a time dedicated to praying for the living. We are also making improvements to the book store. We have hired a decorator as well as the engineers and contractors to make these improvements. 

<u>DONATION REQUESTS</u> TIME, TALENT, OR TREASURE

On Sunday, July 30 Philoptochos passed a collection tray to help the Nativity of the Theotokos Monastery.

The Backstory: A fire occurred on June 15, 2017 when a raging storm settled over the Monastery. Lightning struck the gas lines and ignited the back of the structure. It spread in minutes, undetected to the roof and then the nuns' living quarters. The nuns are living in the farmhouse -a tiny homewhich also houses their candle and icon crafting rooms below. Most of them are sleeping on the floor and several of them have significant health conditions. They all made it out, but the church miraculously was left unscathed. (It's truly a miracle, because they were all connected, as the original monastery.) The nuns are still in great need, as their insurance only pays 80% of the building value and does NOT cover temporary housing. They are trying to purchase two small trailers to live in.

Vacation Church School


