

# SAINT NICHOLAS GREEK ORTHODOX CHURCH

"Meditate upon these things; give yourself wholly to them; that your <u>progress</u> may be evident to all." - 1 Timothy 4:15

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This has been a whirlwind of a Fall for us here at Saint Nicholas. Since my arrival, our staff, Parish Council and ministry leaders, have been working non-stop in preparation for what will undoubtedly be a momentous and memorable year for all. Looking ahead at all that is in store for us as a Church family, it is easy to become daunted or apprehensive. Preparations for our 75th Anniversary celebrations, the reworking of our entire approach to stewardship and parish ministries, security upgrades, large scale facility maintenance projects, and ultimately a potential campus expansion opportunity...It is understandable to feel much like what a young Saint Timothy was feeling as a fledgling disciple of Saint Paul as he was sent to carry out his teacher's work. But, let us examine what the wise Apostle said to his student when facing this enormous task.

Paul tells Timothy (above) to meditate on all of the blessings, instructions and Grace that he has received, and remain confident in them. If he does that, Paul promises Timothy that his <u>progress</u> will be made evident to all. The word "progress" in the original Greek is "prokopé," which literally means to "go forward" ("pro) by "cutting down" ("kopto"). In other words, the Biblical idea of "progress" is <u>the advancement by chopping down whatever impedes one's growth</u>. This is a bold and confident action. It is not something that can be done with timidity or reluctance. It is the explorer who boldly uses his machete to clear out the overgrown vegetation from his path, or the mighty army that confidently advances by tearing down any obstacles along the way. This is the kind of fervor we should all possess in the Church, knowing that when we put our faith in Christ and stay true to His teachings this is the sort of swift progress we can share in, even here in Wilmington.

The final connection I would like to draw is that this ancient concept of progress (by "cutting down"), was not simply used to speak about growth in general, but specifically about the quests of brave <u>pioneers!</u> There is no need to "cut down" obstacles on a path that is already worn and well-trodden. Rather, it is the <u>unbeaten</u> path, the road <u>not</u> traveled that allows for this type of progress. We at Saint Nicholas will take steps this year that <u>have never been taken before!</u> We will be bold enough to walk where others wouldn't dare, and we will find new, trailblazing opportunities to grow our ministry in ways that seemed too imposing or ambitious in decades past.

The work *is* considerable, there is no denying that. There will be those among us who may say that some things simply cannot be done. But calling to mind those blessed disciples, who at our Lord's Resurrection both worshipped Him *and doubted* (Matthew 28:17), we must be careful not to let the small doubts in the back of our minds derail us from the greater glories of our faith. I am confident that in spite of all that lay before us this year, the convictions of our faithful families, and the perfecting Grace of God will supply us in every task.

### **AHEPA Delegation Visits Brussels**

His All Holiness, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, visited the Metropolis of Brussels on the occasion of the Archdiocese's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration, November 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

The Order of AHEPA and its Brussels Chapter, European Eagle Chapter No. A610, financially supported the anniversary events. At the request of Supreme President, George Horiates, Jim Stasios, Supreme Secretary, lead an AHEPA delegation to Brussels. In addition to Stasios, Supreme Treasurer, Savas Tsivicos; Past Supreme President Andy Zachariades; Past Supreme President, Carl Hollister and Supreme Governor, Phanos Pitiris were also members of the AHEPA delegation.

While in Brussels, the AHEPA delegation visited Evangelos Meimarakis, Member of the European Parliament and head of the "Nea Dimokratia" delegation at the EU. In addition, they visited Stravos Hatziyiannis, Cyprus' Permanent Representative to the EU.

Stasios & Tsivicos initiated 5 new members in to the Brussels Chapter and Initiated 10 new members into a new Chapter, Oranje Eagle, Chapter No. A616, in Amsterdam, in the Netherlands.

The delegation attended Patriarchal Esperinos (Vespers) on November 9<sup>th</sup> and a reception hosted by the Orthodox Archdiocese of Belgium and the Exarchate of the Netherlands and Luxemburg at the Brussels Academy Palace.

On Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, the delegation attended the Patriarchal Divine Liturgy at the Cathedral of Archangels Michael and Gabriel. The delegation was invited to a private Archon reception honoring His All Holiness, Patriarch Bartholomew, prior to the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala that evening, which has held in the Steigenberger Hotel's Grand Ballroom. There, over 450 attendees heard remarks by His All Holiness and Metropolitan Athenagoras regarding the 50 year history of the Metropolis. # Letter from Archbishop Elpidophoros of America Regarding New Youth Safety Policies

September 5, 2019

Dear Faithful of the Archdiocese of America,

The beginning of the new Ecclesiastical New Year is a time of hope and diaconia. A time when we ask ourselves and ask the Lord, "how can I best serve my family, my Lord and His Great Church".

I am writing as Archbishop to bring to your attention an important matter that is and must be an urgent concern for all of us who work with children in every aspect of the Archdiocese, in every Metropolis and in every parish and youth ministry.

This letter is to call each of us to action, and to encourage us as our clergy, our lay leaders and our fellow parishioners to mobilize to serve our children and youth. The Archdiocese has distributed a new set of procedures and requirements intended to improve safety for the children in all our Church programs. Youth Safety is our top priority and greatest duty in our family of Orthodox Christians. As we all inherently know, protecting our children and our future requires hard work and diligence.

The new requirements demand that every single person who works with youth in any way in your Parish, your Metropolis and your Archdiocese move rapidly into compliance.

This month of September begins the process of all clergy and all youth workers registering with the designated Youth Protection Parish Administrator at your Church community and being trained by on-line courses, as well as passing a criminal background check. Under this new mandate of our Church, unless a worker completes this process by the end of this year, he or she cannot be allowed to work with parish youth. Many religious and charitable institutions, including some of our own parishes, have been doing training and background checks for years. Now in this new Ecclesiastical New Year, we join them in better training and screening our youth workers and educators to identify and protect our children against all forms of abuse.

There are two obvious first steps for this month of September, naming a Parish Administrator and gathering a completely inclusive list of both paid and volunteer workers whose efforts include contact with children. Anyone who does anything that involves contact with children will have to be registered, trained, and screened by the end of the year, with no exceptions.

Many of you who receive this letter are leaders of various ministries and programs. You are in the best positions to begin compiling lists of people in your ministry who have contact with children and youth. We are relying on your commitment to get this done. Please be aware that the Holy Metropolises and the Direct Archdiocesan District will be sending your Church leadership all that is needed to comply under these Policies for the Safety of Children and Youth.

Thank you for being part of this effort and for working with your Hierarchs, your priest and your parish leadership. May our Lord bless and protect you, your family and your Church family as we begin this Ecclesiastical New Year.






