From the Desk of Fr. Regis John Alexoudis

REFLECTIONS ON GREAT LENT

Recently we celebrated Forgiveness Sunday. I wanted to send you some spiritual food during this Great Lenten Season. Firstly please read this uplifting Gospel Reading found below...I always refer to it as the Gospel with the three F's – that is F for Forgiveness, F for Fasting, and F for Future. May our Lord bless us all with a Holy and Spiritually Fruitful Lenten Season!!

Your Spiritual Father - Father Regis

Matthew 6:14-21

The Lord said, "If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you;

but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

"And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

The Holy Fathers have appointed the commemoration of Adam and Eve's exile from the Paradise of delight here, at the beginning of the holy Forty-day Fast, demonstrating to us not by simple words, but by actual deeds, how beneficial fasting is for man, and how harmful and destructive are the transgressing of the divine commandments. For the first commandment that God gave to man was that of fasting, which the first-fashioned received but did not keep; and not only did they not become gods, as they had imagined, but they lost even that blessed life which they had, and they fell into corruption and death, and transmitted these and innumerable other evils to all of mankind. The God-bearing Fathers set these things before us, that by bringing to mind what we have fallen from, and what we have suffered because of the disobedience of the first-fashioned, we might be diligent to return again to that ancient bliss and glory by means of fasting and obedience to all the divine commands. Taking occasion from this Gospel to complete the Fast unencumbered by enmity, we also ask forgiveness on this day, first from God, then from one another and all creation. Finally the Gospel reading ends by reminding us of the ultimate Future... where our treasure is, that is where our heart and soul be also!

As always, if you need any assistance please feel free to contact me with any questions, suggestions, or concerns.





Demetri was the recipient of the Spanakos Brothers High School Scholar-Athlete Award, which was presented at the Athletic Luncheon of the 96th AHEPA Supreme Convention in Atlantic City this past July. He is a freshman at the University of North Carolina Charlotte.

Maria and Pantelis are the children of brother John and Athena Poulos. Maria will finish her course work at Cape Fear Community College in the spring and plans to transfer to the University of North Carolina Wilmington in order to pursue a career in teaching at the elementary school level. 




