



# SAINT NICHOLAS GREEK ORTHODOX CHURCH

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

By now we have spoken at length about the challenges of the Coronavirus. We have heard your fears and we have felt your frustrations. While we wish that the pandemic would just end and that we could go back to "normal life," we understand that it isn't as simple as that. It is a near certainty that we will be enduring this for quite some time still to come.

"Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord." - James 5:14

As we see in James' Universal Letter, the Church has always been a place of refuge during times of sickness. The Holy Apostle encourages the faithful to not allow the fear of illness push them into hiding, but allow it to be an opportunity to connect more deeply with their faith. That is where the Church comes in. We are here for moments like this. The very hospitals that we are depending on to defeat the virus were first created within the context of the Christian Church. In the middle of the fourth century, famine broke out. Saint Basil, then a priest, immediately created free public services for those suffering from hunger. To achieve this, he had to fight, prove, hunt for, and even scream at the rich, to convince them to open their food supplies and share with the hungry. In 372, he finished building his famous complex, "The Basileiad." In the center of the complex there was a magnificent church, and around it there were structures, guest houses/hotels, schools, orphanages, homes for the poor, and the hospital itself. Such a thing had not existed anywhere else. Saint Basil personally supervised the work, gave advice to the builders, and worked himself.

But the hospitals are not the only places you can find care in times like these. Our faith also is famous for making "house calls." Recall, once more our theme for our 2021 Stewardship Campaign. The passage is found in the eighth chapter of Luke, where Christ heals the woman who simply touches the hem of His garment. That entire scene came to pass because Christ was summoned by Jairus to help his daughter who was gravely ill...*at home*! We know that Christ eventually did make it Jairus' home and brought healing and comfort to his daughter and her family.

That is what the Church has always practiced, and what she continues to practice today. In a year in which we are encouraged to stay home, one could argue that there has never been a more important time in the Church's history for these in-house visitations. Though right now *the doors of the Church* may be too difficult for your family to walk through, we pray that *the doors of your home* are still open for us! In the coming month, we at Saint Nicholas will begin preparing our schedule for our New Year House Visits following the feast of Epiphany. *It is our goal to visit all of our families and bless every home!* This will take considerable coordination and flexibility, but it is our belief that now more than ever, it is the role of the Church to seek out and meet our faithful in a time when the faithful are unable to come to us.

We thank you in advance for your constant support of our Saint Nicholas Family, and we pray that our God will always bless us here in Wilmington.

Our updated schedule is as follows.


Friday, October 22, 2021 – "Welcome Reception" at Saint Nicholas Church

2019 financials were audited in the spring by Koula Katsikis, Barbara Reynolds and Pauline McHugh – thank you for your support.

#### Additional Financial updates include:

- The PPP money received by the government has been forgiven and will not need to be paid back (\$22,600).
- The Metropolis has restructured the Pension Plan allocations for each church from a standard fee to one that is based on the size of the church. St. Nicholas' commitment will stay the same \$600/month).
- The Metropolis received PPP money and will be crediting each church with one month's fee toward the archdioceses allocation for 2020 (\$2942.47).
- We have hired a bookkeeper, Brenda Spooner, who will provide support to the Treasurer with paying bills and other financial tasks. Brenda will work approximately 20 hours month.

## Building Report Nick Saffo

Since our purchase of the 606 South College Road property our Parish Council and Building Committee have been hard at work to get the "Back Building" ready for use. Starting in July we began renovations to the front and back portions of the space with great success. We are happy to report that we were able to ready the front half of the building in time for the start of the 2020 academic year. This allowed us to secure Wilmington School of the Arts as our tenant for this year (and hopefully beyond). Additionally, our team has been hard at work converting the back half of the building back into a gymnasium and activity center. We are thrilled to announce that we are nearing completion on that project and we are on pace to have our **Grand Opening** Event on our Feast day, **Sunday December 6** after the Divine Liturgy.















With the purchase of the "Back Building" we doubled our campus and took a giant leap forward in this new chapter of our Church's history. But the work doesn't stop there! We secured a tenant in the front half of the building, and are hard at work con-

verting the back half into a gymnasium/activity space for our faithful. Now we need you to step forward as our **CHAMPIONS** to help us complete these goals. Detailed below are two opportunities for all of our families to contribute towards our efforts. #### NEW STEWARDSHIP UPGRADES FOR 2021 Saint Nicholas Partners with "Abundant Giving"

The Saint Nicholas Stewardship Committee has been hard at work this year during the pandemic. We have realized that this may be a trying time physically, emotionally, and financially for many of our families. We are here for you and want to serve you in any way we can.

Due to the global health crisis, Church attendance has gone down in efforts to remain safe and socially distant. This has impacted our faithfull's ability to connect (and in many ways give) to Saint Nicholas in person. We are proud to announce that we have upgraded our online giving system, allowing for our believers to still support their spiritual home even from a distance. The benefits with this "Abundant Giving" program include:

- Mobile giving from any device
- Choose what account/card to use
- Give to multiple funds at any time
- No more having to find a check/cash
- Schedule gifts to occur automatically
- Help reduce fees for the Church
- Manage your stewardship directly by creating an online account

#### STEWARDSHIP UPDATE Barbara Reynolds & Melissa Kirkby

Thank you to the St. Nicholas Stewards who have supported our church this year! The church has been able to continue to support both our business expenses and our ministries during this very challenging year. Every week in the email blasts you see the activities available to our parish family to grow our faith, to help those in our community, and for fellowship. In addition, we have implemented new software to make it easier to manage your stewardship online or even via text.

Our Stewardship goal in 2020 is \$279,361. As of November 11, 173 families (63% of our parish family) have pledged to support St. Nicholas in 2020. We have received pledges of \$237,692 which is 85% of our goal. Stewardship contributed to date is \$204,463 or 73% of our goal.

Everyone should have received their 2021 Stewardship packets in the mail. If you haven't received your packet, please contact the office.

November 15 kicked off our 2021 Stewardship Campaign. During the Divine Liturgy on November 15, our pledge envelopes were offered to God in a special dedication service. Our prayers are for a blessed 2021 at our beloved St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church.

75% of the Saint Nicholas budget comes from Stewardship, and on average it costs approximately \$1,800 to operate the parish annually per family. Without you filling out your stewardship pledge card each and every year, we cannot exist. Everything we possess are gifts from God and they ultimately belong to Him. They are given to us - by Him. For this reason, we understand Stewardship to be a spiritual excercise of thanksgiving. These are NOT "membership dues," but rather free offerings in appreciation for all that God has done for you. If you haven't filled out your 2021 Stewardship Pledge Envelope - please, do so today (they are located in the pews). "God loves a cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7)."

## Policies for the Safety of Youth & Children Stella McTaggart

Not everyone likes to eat broccoli, some people don't like to read, and others of us don't want to go camping. Each person is different and unique and special. We are all made just the way God wanted us to be. But, what we ALL have to do now is follow some simple standards at church and outside of church. And these include **Wear** (a mask), **Wait** (6 feet apart), and **Wash** (your hands for 20 seconds, the same amount of time it takes you to recite *The Lord's Prayer*.) The NC Department of Health and Human Services has been reminding us all to take these steps to protect ourselves and care for others in our day to day lives.

The WAIT part is what really ties in well with the Policies for the Safety of Youth & Children. In the training to become a certified youth worker, you learn about always asking permission to touch a child BEFORE you touch them. And in most cases, it is best to avoid physically touching any child. It is really hard for a lot of us to do this because you just want to rub the back of a baby, or pick up a running toddler, or thump the back of a child for a job well done. But remember, if you are doing any of these things, you are not WAITING 6 feet apart from that child. By getting into the habit of physically distancing yourself from the youth of our community, you will automatically be following the standards set forth in the Policies for the Safety of Youth & Children AND the recommendations from the NCDHHS.

I know I appreciate the efforts everyone is making to ensure our Church is a safe place for adults and children alike. Kudos to a job well done! Let's continue in our efforts:

Thank you to our SEVEN Certified Youth Workers who have completed their certification for the 2020-2021 Ecclesiastical Year. I am expecting SIXTY-FIVE more of our congregation to join their ranks by Sunday, November 22, 2020 to be compliant with the Policies for the Safety of Youth & Children as deemed by the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. Recertification instructions had been emailed to all 2019-2020 participants at the beginning of November. The entire process should take less than 10 minutes.

If you would like to join us as a NEW CERTIFIED YOUTH WORKER it is 3 easy steps – register, screen, and training. For more information about this process, please contact me at <a href="wouthsafety@stnicholaswilmington.org">wouthsafety@stnicholaswilmington.org</a>. A certified youth worker is the only adult allowed to participate in youth ministries and events - and that includes our ONLINE EVENTS. If you are a Sunday School teacher please register ASAP for this current year.




