

Whether you feel comfortable attending a Divine Liturgy on Sunday, or your limit is simply to come and light a candle during office hours during the week, we want to help you connect with God this Lent. 





Hellenic School Anestis Logothetis

This year is the 200th Anniversary of the Greek Independence Revolution. There will be celebrations all over the world, although limited to some degree due to the pandemic. We as members of the Greek diaspora would also like to celebrate the best way we can.

The Greek School would like to ask the local AHEPA Chapter to join us in planning the celebration which will take place on Sunday March 28. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic we are uncertain whether the Hellenic Center will be open for coffee hour by then. If by then the danger of COVID-19 has passed and the Hall will be open we will ask Father Steven to offer a memorial service (μνημοσυνο) in the Church for the heroes of the Greek Revolution and then we will have the celebration at the Hall which will be decorated appropriately. We will have a guest speaker, poems from some of the Greek School children, Greek dances from the youth and fruit and desserts. If the pandemic still is with us and the Hellenic Center is not available then we will ask Father Steven to offer the memorial service and the speaker will deliver his talk in Church afterwards in lieu of the sermon. Kolyva will be given to all in attendance as they leave the Church.

This year we are delighted to have Mayor Bill Saffo accept our invitation to be the guest speaker. He is a good and inspirational person on the podium and he will give more importance to the occasion. Whatever the situation is we invite all parishioners to participate in our celebration if they possibly can.

200th Anniversary of the Greek Independence

This year Greece will be celebrating the 200th Anniversary of the start of the revolution against the Ottomans who had occupied Greece for almost 400 years. Constantinople, the Capital of the Byzantine empire fell to the Ottomans in 1453 and soon after Greece and all places which had large numbers of Greek population in the Balkans and Asia Minor were occupied. A curtain of darkness came down on our ancestors. However, the hope of freedom and independence never died. Greeks in the occupied territories and in the European diaspora formed the secret Φιλικη Εταιρια or "friendly Society". Their purpose was to unite the populace and organize a revolution to overthrow the Ottomans and liberate their land. They were inspired first by the American Revolution where the people overthrew the powerful British and second from the French Revolution which overthrew their powerful King. They felt strongly that if the Americans and French can succeed to overthrow their oppressors, they could as well. An uprising took place on March 25, 1821 initiated by Bishop Germanos of Patras. The Christian religion played an important role in giving people hope and through the secret schools providing education to the children. It took almost ten years of hard and heroic fighting against the powerful Turks. In 1830 finally Greece became an independent country and a national Government was established. The national Anthem which is an hymn to liberty, reflects the desire of the people to regain freedom after almost 400 years slavery and imprisonment (σκλαβια και φυλακη).

Do wonderful things for us, your servants, and show your mighty power to our children. Psalm 90:16

I love to go to the beach and dip my toes in the water when it is warm or just watch the crash of the waves against the sand when it is cold. If I asked you if you could go into a bathroom to watch children at the Church wash their hands, what would you answer?* If you were a CERTIFIED YOUTH WORKER you would know the answer to this question and many more.

As you join us in <u>wearing</u> your mask, <u>waiting</u> six feet apart, and <u>washing</u> your hands, become a CERTIFIED YOUTH WORKER so you can take your shot at helping and participating in youth ministries and events. The time is now!

Thank you to our 38 Certified Youth Workers who have completed their certification for the 2020-2021 Ecclesiastical Year. I am expecting THIRTY THREE more of our congregation to join their ranks to recertify themselves. The recertification process should take less than 10 minutes.



THIS MONTH keeping with our LOVE theme, our "LOVE" ministry will launch its sessions for our youngest families. "LOVE" is the Church ministry that serves our children ages 0-4 years old. 
