Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is with great longing and deep gratitude that I write you. Since Mid-Lent our doors have been shut, forcing the faithful to worship from their homes remotely due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. Yet this time apart has been put to the best use possible. We have made great strides in our technology ministries by completely revamping our Church website and livestream services. We have found creative means of reaching out to our faithful via personal phone calls to every household, as well conducting our parish meetings, weekly Sunday School classes, and Synaxis sessions using "Zoom" and "Youtube Live." Finally, not even this global Pandemic could derail the monumental step we took last month towards our future when we completed the long-awaited purchase of the "Back Building" (606 S College Road)!

Despite all of this, we still felt a tremendous hole in our hearts as the pews remained empty week after week. Thus, we are thrilled to have received the blessing from the Metropolis to reopen our doors to you the faithful this month! This process will be a gradual transition, and we are taking the appropriate measures to make sure that we do not jeopardize the health of our Saint Nicholas Family. Please be aware of the following protocols of note:

- All MUST wear a face mask at all times.
- All must "sign in" (providing a Phone number)
- Temperatures will be taken at the door
- All must wash/sanitize hands upon entering/exiting
- No service books will be provided
- Candles will be lit for you by our Parish Council
- All will be seated 6 feet apart (all "overflow" attendees will worship from the Fellowship Hall or their cars)
- There will be no socializing/gathering after the service (no hugs, kisses, or handshakes)
- Holy Communion will be offered in the usual manner (but antidoron will only be given at dismissal)

We assure you that we are doing all that we can to promote the health and safety of our faithful. Even so, we understand if some parishioners are still a little hesitant to venture out into public. Furthermore, we highly encourage our seniors and our stewards making up the "at risk population" to continue to worship from home using our online livestream. 


In April, the Audit Committee reviewed the 2019 financials and the Archdiocese Commitment allocation documents. A few updates were made and in May the Archdiocese finalized the information we submitted and is used to calculate our 2021 commitments.

In May we received our PPP money (\$22,500) we applied for via the Small Business Administration federal money relief program to cover payroll coverage for 2.5 months.

Operating Account: As of the end of April, our operating income/expenses YTD are in the positive. We continue to see stewardship funds mailed in from many and we appreciate those who have been consistently giving. Since church attendance has dropped our candle and donation income has dropped significantly. You can light a virtual candle on line through our website.

Policies for the Safety of Youth and Children Stella McTaggart

Do you know what is a "Certified Youth Worker?" If yes, GREAT! If no, let me share: Only Certified Youth Workers and participating Children and/or Youth are eligible to participate in Youth Ministry Programs and Events. There will be no exceptions.

We have 67 Certified Youth Workers for our Church. These adults can participate in any youth event in the entire Archdiocese of America. BRAVO!! As of the latest tally we are TIED for THIRD PLACE with Maitland/Orlando in the Metropolis for the largest number of volunteers who have completed all 3 steps to become Certified Youth Workers. Way to go!!

For those who are already certified: you will have to reregister for the upcoming Ecclesiastical Year. Watch for more information coming to the email used for registration.

For anyone who would like to join our list of Certified Youth Workers, our Open Enrollment Registration Period for the upcoming Ecclesiastical Year begins June 1 and lasts until August 31, 2020. To register just go to https://forms.gle/4t46jHYonrp4FHst9 and fill out the 4 easy questions. This is STEP 1 in the process. Briefly, STEP 2 is watching online training and taking tests at home. STEP 3 is paying for and completing a background check SPECIFICALLY for this program. Other background checks cannot be substituted for the PRAESIDIUM/ARMATUS background check.

ast month the Saint Nicholas Family completed a decadeslong process of purchasing the property of 606 S. College Road (affectionately known as "the Back Building").

Beginning in May of 2018, at our Special General Assembly Meeting, this endeavor officially took form when a vast majority of the 57 voting members in attendance (55 in favor) voted to authorize the Parish Council to purchase the GLOW building behind our church. The motion that was passed and set the stage for negotiations to begin with the seller, Mr. Craig, for up to \$1 million.

During the nearly two ensuing years of negotiat-

ing, the Parish Council ran into many "road blocks" in attempts to attain the property, always operating with the Church's best interests in mind. However, the persistence paid off, and eventu-

ally the Parish Council Officers were able to work the seller down from his asking price of \$1.2 million to the approved amount of \$1 million. Once we received the final blessing of His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios, we entered into an official contract to purchase the building on March 6, 2020.



During the due diligence process the parish council obtained several loan estimates from local financial institutions, with the most favorable being that of our longtime bank, First Citizen's. The bank then ordered the ensuing appraisal which estimated its value at \$950,000. Additionally the Parish Council had completed a thorough inspection of the property and found that it was in remarkably good shape with the exception of a few HVAC units that needed repairs

We presented our findings to the seller, and after many back-

and-forth exchanges through our lawyers, we were able to attain a final price of \$980,000.

The Parish Council held several conference calls throughout this process, and even convened a special session where these final terms of the contract were discussed. Ultimately it was unanimously agreed that it was in the best interest for the parish to continue with the purchase of the building. The council members considered all of the

information and even the potential unknown factors revolving around the current Coronavirus. In the end, the Parish Council felt confident in carrying out the will of our faithful as moved in the 2018 General Assembly, and did not want to risk missing this incredible opportunity for growth for the Church.

So with great pride and tremendous thanksgiving, the Parish Council Officers along with Fr. Steven gathered to review and sign the final documents on May 12, 2020. The following morning the documents were delivered to the courts and the ownership of the "Back Building" was officially transferred over to Saint Nicholas!

Since then, the council has been hard at work developing and executing the financial plans to pay for and develop the building for the Church's needs. The intent is to secure a tenant for the front 5000 square footage of the building with minimal cosmetic updates. This would bring in approximately \$5,000 per month to offset the loan payment, and still allow us to refurbish and make use of the gym and activity space in the back portion. After an extensive interview process with several commercial realtors, the council de-

cided on signing with Cape Fear Commercial who is able to present the Church with an impressive package that was difficult to match by the other candidates. It is the goal of the Parish Council to pair the rental income with proceeds from the annual Greek Festival and generous contributions from our faithful as part of our upcoming Capital Campaign to aggressively pay off the remaining balance of the loan with First Citizen's (well before its maturity date in seven years).

This is a huge step towards a bright future for our Saint Nicholas Church Family, but it is only ONE step. While this is cause for celebration, it is also a call to attention. This acquisition will benefit the entire parish, and as such, we will be counting on the support of ALL the faithful. Your contributions, no matter how big or small, will certainly make a difference, and will be equally appreciated. May God bless our Saint Nicholas Family in this new and exciting era in our proud history!

Frowth & Planning

he purchase of the Back Building is undoubtedly a landmark occasion for our Saint Nicholas Family. This process began back in 1979, and we are so thrilled to finally be in a position to realize it now. It is our firm belief that the acquisition of this property will position us for a season

of growth and a new chapter of ministry for our faithful.

In light of this anticipated growth, the Parish Council has formed a special Growth & Planning Committee with the expressed pur-

pose of assisting them in creating the vision and plan for the future of our parish. Chaired by Parish Council Vice President Lee King, the mission of the "Growth & Planning" Committee is to assess where we are as a parish, and to identify where we want to be in the future (both short-term and long-term).

The committee held its first preliminary virtual meeting on Thursday, May 28 via Zoom (pictured below) and are already hard at work for you the faithful. It is important to understand that the primary function of this committee is to understand the needs and hopes of our faithful. Be aware that you may

be contacted very soon by a committee member. Please be ready and willing to give your input. This Committee works for you!

Introducing Our Capital Campaign Committee

When our Lord rose from the dead. He did not greet the Disciples by saying "well done, your job is finished." In fact the opposite is true. Rather than give them rest, Christ instructs His Disciples to get to work. He tells His Disciples that "Repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things" (Luke 24:47). The same can be said about our recent victory in purchasing the "Back Building" property.

This is an incredible moment for our parish, but we will only realize our potential if our faithful work to support it. Our committee members Daphne Snow, Dino Psilos, and Tina Bostic are working in developing a campaign strategy to help engage our faithful in this endeavor. The committee is confident that our Saint Nicholas Family will answer the call and that we will be able to aggressively pay down the remaining balance on the mortgage, and help fund our future campus expansion and renovation projects. The Church has already roughly funded the first quarter of the balance executing the contract. Ideally, the working target is that annual Greek Festival proceeds can cover up to half of the remaining balance, and the final quarter (or more) could be supplied by financial contributions from our faithful.






